Rebecca was born prematurely in April 2009 and has been diagnosed with severe quadriplegic cerebral palsy, hydrocephalus, insipidus diabetes and chronic lung disease. She lives with her nan, Denise who is her full-time carer.

In September 2018 Lagan's Foundation started supporting Rebecca and Denise. Our carers would sit and help Rebecca, to give Denise the chance to have a small break from her full-time caring role.

Denise says; "My life has changed for the better because of the help and care Rebecca, myself and my family have from Lagan's Foundation. They have supported myself and Rebecca in every way that they could, this enables me to go out to the bingo or see family members which couldn't do before.

They have succeeded in getting my granddaughter into an excellent sleeping routine which I tried to do but did not achieve, this has made my sleep pattern great as I am getting a good night's sleep which is needed to care for Rebecca. It also gives Rebecca a good night's sleep in her own bed.

Rebecca enjoys the carers coming over, they do activities and crafts with her and when it's nice weather she is able to walk me to the bingo with the Carer. Weather is the key decision maker as to whether Rebecca can go out or stay indoors due to her reoccurring chest infections, she really enjoys going out.

"I cannot thank Lagan's Foundation enough for what they have achieved with Rebecca making our life so much easier in such a short time."



We WON The Executive Children & Young People Leader Award!

We're celebrating after winning The Executive Children & Young People Leader Award at a top London awards ceremony on 19th October 2022!

We were presented with the prestigious Social Care Leadership Award at a Care Talk ceremony at London's Marriott Hotel in Grosvenor Square.

Emily, our Marketing Assistant, nominated our Founder, Carren, for the award and said:

"I nominated Carren because after working with her for over a year, I saw that she was making a huge difference to everyone she works with, whether that be staff or the families we support. "She is an inspirational leader and mentor, and I wanted her to get the recognition she deserved."

Carren attended the event with long term friend, Scott and enjoyed an evening of festivities, including a panel discussion on the state of the Health and Social Care industry and its challenges, a three course meal and electric string quartet, followed by plenty of socialising.

Carren said: "We were amazed we even made the finalist stage amongst such incredible, well-established organisations. We were just pleased to be in the room and were ready to soak up the atmosphere and make new contacts – we weren't disappointed."

Other nominees on the evening included Home Instead, The National Care Association, Barchester Healthcare, Nugent Care, Blue Light Card, Stephensons Solicitors, Hays, Brakes Food Service and many more.



"Our table was incredible and there was a huge amount of support between the other nominees who sat with us, including Raj from Person Centred Software and Charlotte Driver-Young from Christies Care. We also met Shawbrooks Bank and really look forward to speaking to them moving forward.

We have previously attended The Markel Third Sector Care Awards in 2019 at the same venue and won the Leadership Award, so it was nice to be back in the same room with another win.

The Great British Care Awards Newcomer Award Finalist

In 2020 Sarah Shead made the courageous decision to begin her career as a home care worker at Lagan's Foundation, after being furloughed from her teaching position due to Covid. She wanted to continue working and making a difference where she could.

Her plan was to go back to teaching once schools re-opened, so when she was offered the full-time care-coordinator role she turned it down and returned to teaching but still provided care in her spare time. Six weeks after returning to teaching, Sarah called Carren and asked if the position was still open, that's where her journey in her current role began as Care Coordinator for Lagan's Foundation.

Lagan's Foundation is a Bolton based charity who provide unique home health care and respite in the Northwest for families and children living with complex health needs, specialising in heart defects and feeding issues. Working with children is a career Sarah has always had a passion for, so working for Lagan's Foundation was a dream come true for her. She has created an amazing bond with the families and children that she works with, and she works her hardest to make sure all Lagan's carers give the best care possible.





Lagan's Foundations CEO, Carren Bell says "From the time Sarah joined our team to the present day, has been a roller coaster, managing a new role and people, handling ever changing Covid requirements and government demands, to growing a team and becoming a major part in the charity. Sarah has grown professionally and personally. Life hasn't been easy but Sarah has serious resilience and tenacity to ensure people receive what they deserve and need."

Sarah believes the care industry, is very undervalued, that care staff make a huge difference to peoples lives without the shoutout they deserve. Every person in the care industry works hard to make sure they provide the best care to the whole family, not just the person they are taking care of.

Her role at Lagan's Foundation began in one of the most uncertain times, but since taking on the Care Coordinator position, she worked her hardest to expand the charity and her team. Since September 2020 Sarah had manage to expand the Manchester base to become the charities biggest base, they now support many children in and around the Manchester area.

Children come first to Sarah and the whole team. To them, making sure every child and family is safe and supported is the main priority.

Lagan's Foundation is a Bolton-based charity which provides respite and at-home care for families with children who have complex health needs across the Northwest of England.

During the Covid-19 pandemic, Lagan's Foundation not only worked throughout the entire pandemic, but they took on extra carers meaning they could increase their support load by a staggering 89%.

The afternoon at the House of Lords, began with a welcome reception where Carren and Emily met Lord Palmer and lots of other highlevel Social Care professionals from all around the UK.





There were inspired speeches from Lord Palmer of Child's Hill, Professor Martin Green OBE and many others, the room heard about the trials and tribulations social care had to face during the pandemic and the continuing struggles the sector are facing.

Lord Palmer said "I am delighted to be able to host this very special event at the House of Lords to pay tribute to social care staff who have gone above and beyond during the Covid-19 pandemic."

The Afternoon Tea was hosted in the Cholmondeley Room where they were greeted by a beautifully decorated room filled with tables set up for afternoon tea.

Following a Thankyou from the Care Awards team and Lord Palmer, everyone had the opportunity to go onto the terrace to see the sights of London and The Thames before leaving the event.

MORE Awards - finalists 2022

On Friday 24th September, Carren and the Lagan's team headed to Blackpool for the prestigious EVA's award ceremony, organised by Pink Link Ladies, held at Winter Gardens.

The evening saw over 700 hundred women gathered to celebrate female entrepreneurship across the North West.



Carren had been nominated anonymously for the prestigious Charity of the Year award, and after successfully making it to be a finalist she took part in a 20 minute interview with a panel of judges.

On the 26th of March the Digi Accountancy team (Adam, Al, Luke and 3 friends) took on the incredible Ben Nevis Mountain in aid of Lagan's Foundation.

In Scotland, Ben Nevis is the highest mountain of the British Isles. Its summit, reaching an elevation of 4,406 feet, is actually the tallest peak anywhere for 700km, crossing the North Sea to the west coast of Norway.

Thier aim was to raise £1,000 and they managed to surpass that by over £600, raising a fantastic £1690.

Meet Maryam – We started supporting Maryam and her family in March 2021 as part of our Donated Care Project. Maryam was born with a congenital Heat Defect "Atrioventricular Septal Defect" in August 2020 and requires a lot of extra support and care from her family and Lagan's carers.

Lagan's Donated Care Project allows us to support Maryam and her family for 2 hours per week at no cost to them. The project is fully funded by fundraising and grants obtained by the charity and allows us to help support families with children aged 0-5 who aren't eligible for personal budgets or commissioned services.

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
